If it can happen at Pike Place Market, it can happen on The Ave.

Two Saturdays • May 30 & June 6 • from 11am - 8pm • between 42nd & 43rd

This summer, The Ave is getting an upgrade: on two Saturdays, we are closing **one block** to cars and opening it up to people. Expect games, a giant chess board, live music, cafe seating, and the nearby farmers market in full swing. Whether you stop for five minutes or settle in for the afternoon, there is something here for you.

Why it matters. The Ave is one of Seattle's most vibrant and culturally rich corridors, but its sidewalks are narrow, seating is scarce, and the street has always prioritized cars over the people who make it worth visiting. This pilot is a chance to show what University Way looks like when people come first.

Two Saturdays. One big question. *Can a people-centered street on The Ave create real benefit for the neighborhood: its businesses, its residents, its community?* We are here to prove it can. Every person who shows up helps make that case harder to ignore.

Show up. Bring a friend. Volunteers are needed to help set up, greet visitors, run activities, and gather feedback. No experience necessary, just enthusiasm for the U District and the idea that **streets are for people**.
